The Short Stories Reading Workshop, which was organized by the SCOLAR

English Alliance 2018/19 Programme, was held at the Hong Kong Cultural Centre. In the workshop, our students read an adapted short story of Heart of Darkness with students from another secondary school under the guidance of Miss Heather. Heart of Darkness, which was written by Joseph Conrad, is widely regarded as a significant work in English literature. It tells Charles Marlow's experience as an ivory transporter down the Congo River in Central Africa.

Upon our arrival, Miss Heather's lively introduction interested and engaged our students. Students actively participated in reading aloud the short stories, identifying key elements of the story and writing an alternative ending to the story.

Not only did students share their views on the plots and characters, but they also reflected deeply and shared insights on racism and the relationship between the socalled civilised people and those described as savages.

The Reading Workshop is a wonderful opportunity to reinforce students' literacy, as well as allow students of different schools to gather, share, and reflect as a learning community. As students move from "learning to read" to "reading to learn," reading helps them become critical thinkers and lifelong learners.
